ELGIN COUNTY 2021 BUDGET



Elgin County Council approved the <u>2021 Municipal Budget</u> with a **2.9%** tax rate increase over 2020. The budget is in alignment with Council's <u>2020-2022 Strategic Plan</u> Priority of Investing in Elgin by making responsible financial decisions through:



Ensuring Elgin has the necessary tools, resources and infrastructure to deliver programs and services now and in the future; and,



Delivering mandated programs and services efficiently and effectively.

Efficiencies

\$0.2 M ANNUALLY

Homes efficiencies achieved predominately through improvements to the Case Mix Index (CMI).

Cost Increases

\$0.9 M ANNUALLY

Facilities Capital Maintenance.

\$0.1 M ANNUALLY

Insurance Increases.

Service Enhancements

\$0.15 M ANNUALLY

In Community Improvement Plan Funding through budget tightening in other Economic Development Budget Lines.

\$0.06 M ANNUALLY

In future years for library expansion.

\$0.3 M ANNUALLY

Net costs to implement priority recommendations contained within the <u>Service Delivery Review</u> as identified by County Council.

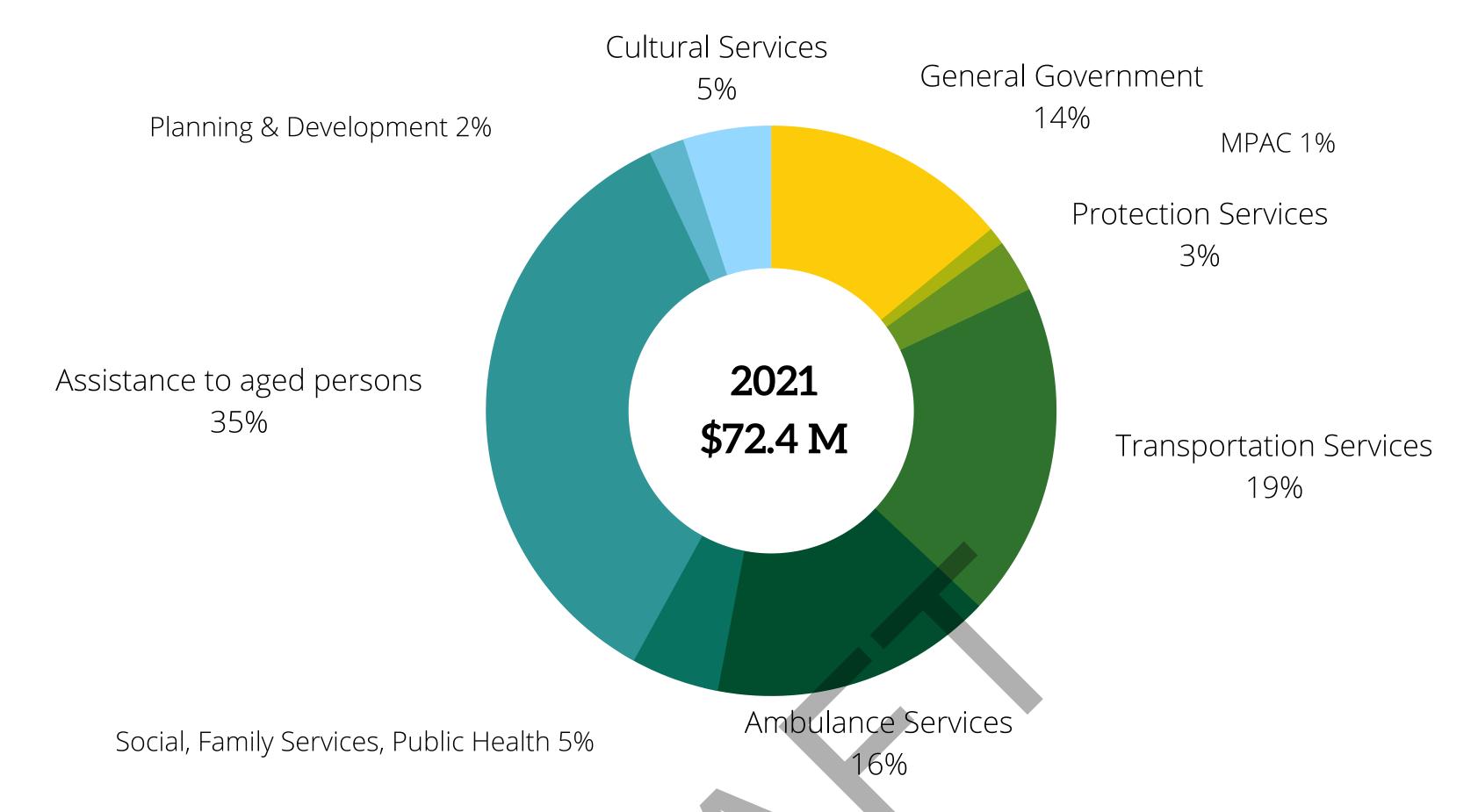
